Quick Work in a Divorce Case.
 Last Saturday - afternoon Mrs. Maude M. Bogart, in the district court instituted proceedings for a divorce. She claimed to have been cruelly and inhumanly treated by her husband E. S. Bogart. In a few minutes the case was brought to trial. Mr. Bogart admitted a part of the charges. After hearing the testimony Judge Smith granted the decree of divorce, gave Mrs. Bogart the custody of the children until they were 14 years old at which age they can choose for themselves which parents they will live with. Mrs. Bogart was also given \$1,750 in money. Less than a quarter of an hour was consumed in untying the nuptial knot.

Wants Divorce Case Reopened.
 A rather sensational suit has been commenced in the district court this week by Mrs. E. L. Bogart, who was divorced from her husband a short time ago. In her petition or complaint she asks that the decree of divorce be reconsidered and reopened.
 The complaint recites in brief that since the divorce was granted it has come to her knowledge that her husband is worth much more money than she thought at the time she got her divorce, notably claiming that he is worth at least 11,095, and claims that he has other property not enumerated that is worth \$20,000.
 At the time the divorce was granted Mrs. Bogart was awarded \$1,750, and the custody of the children with nothing for their maintenance. She now demands \$3,250, and \$15 per month each for the support of the three children, besides \$750 for a tree claim that she alleges the defendant sold, keeping the money.
