Englehorn Elmer G vs Englehorn Margaret Tracy 24 Oct 1913 p8

A divorce was granted to Elmer G. Englehorn from Margaret Tracy Englehorn on October 22. The defendant did not appear to contest the case.

Flynn Maggie S vs Flynn John W 21 May 1913 p8

Complaints in two actions for divorce have been filed in the district court. Maggie S. Flynn vs. John W. Flynn, and Hazel S. Squires vs. Whinnifred F. Squires are the titles of the cases. Desertion is named as the cause of the complaint in both instances.

Gaines Mary vs Gaines Eugene W 21 Jul 1913 p5

Complaint in an action for divorce was filed in district court today by Mary Gaines against Eugene W. Gaines. The plaintiff alleges non-support and cruelty, and asks for the custody of her minor child, Wilfred Edward Gaines. The couple were married in this city November 19, 1909.

Gardner vs Gardner Elias C 22 Apr 1913 p5

Divorce has been granted to Mrs. M. Gardner vs. Elias C. Gardner. Plaintiff retains custody of child.

Gregory Leah L vs Gregory Harry G 18 Jul 1913 p5

Yesterday complaint was filed in the case of Leah L. Gregory against Harry G. Gregory. The instrument sets forth that the couple were married in this city July 2, 1911, and the defendant is charged with non-support and desertion. The court is asked to grant the divorce, and such other relief as may be deemed proper under the circumstances, and also that former name of the plaintiff, Leah L. Drake, be restored.

Grant Mabel E vs Grant Ernest A 2 Dec 1913 p5

Divorce was granted yesterday to Mrs. Mabel E. Grant from Ernest A. Grant. The couple were married in Weir, Nebraska, in 1896. Desertion was the grounds for granting the divorce.

Groot Frances E vs Groot Edward 23 May 1913 p3

Complaint in a divorce action entitled Frances E. Groot vs. Edward G. Groot, was filed in district court May 23. Attorney J. E. Rockwood appears for the plaintiff, who asks for the divorce on the grounds of desertion.

15 Aug 1913 p4

MRS. FRANCES GROOT IS GRANTED A DIVORCE
A decree of divorce was granted in district court yesterday to Mrs. Frances Groot from Edward Groot, desertion and non-support being named as the grounds. She is a daughter of Robert McFadden of Smith valley, where she is well and favorably known, was awarded the custody of her minor child, Francis Marion Groot. J. E. Rockwood appeared for the plaintiff.

Hardie Daisy M vs Hardie George W 18 Jul 1913 p5

Daisy M. Hardie vs. George W. Hardie is the title of the action filed today. Mrs. Hardie's complaint sets forth that she and the defendant were married in Kalispell May 3, 1910, and non-support and desertion are charged. Two minor children are the result of the union, of which the plaintiff asks to be granted the custody.

Harrow Frank Morris vs Harrow Flossie Slover 10 Jan 1913 p4

SUES TO ANNUL MARRIAGE OF HIS MINOR DAUGHTER
Alvin Slover has filed suit for annulment of marriage against Frank Morris Harrow, his son-in-law of two weeks. Slover sets forth in the action, that his daughter, Flossie, is and was at the time of her marriage, but 17 years of age. He also alleges that Harrow, her husband, is but 19 and that he secured the license without the consent of parents or guardian. Notice of the suit was served on the young man Wednesday.

Holcomb Kate J vs Holcomb George D 21 Oct 1913 p8

Mrs. Kate J. Holcomb filed action asking for divorce from George D. Holcomb on October 17. The complaint sets forth that the couple were married in Wisconsin on December 16, 1911, and that immediately thereafter Holcomb deserted his wife. Desertion and non-support are named as causes of action. J. E. Henley appears for Mrs. Holcomb.

A divorce was granted Saturday to Mrs. Kate J. Holcomb from George D. Holcomb.

Julian Mary vs Julian Peter 4 Jun 1913 p5

MRS. JULIAN WANTS DIVORCE
Complaint in a divorce action, entitled Mary Julian vs. Peter Julian was filed in district court June 3. The document states that the couple were married on December 12, 1908, having been previously married and divorced, and that two minor children, Michael and Rosa, are the issue of the previous marriage. Mrs. Julian charges cruel and inhuman treatment, including the use of vile language in the presence of the children, and states that on May 24 the defendant assaulted her with a butcherknife, cutting one of her hands.

Kirk Grace M vs Kirk Alexander 24 Sep 1913 p8

A divorce action has been instituted by Mrs. Grace M. Kirk against Alexander Kirk. The plaintiff charges non-support and asks that she be granted the custody of her minor son and permanent alimony in the sum of \$25 per month for the support of herself and child. The defendant, through his attorney, has today filed an answer and cross-complaint. W. T. McKeown appears for Mrs. Kirk.

A divorce was granted this morning to Mrs. Grace M. Kirk from Alexander Kirk. The son of the couple was placed in the custody of Tom Kirka, the defendant, and each of the parties to the action are to contribute \$25 per month to the support of the child. Thompson & Thompson are the plaintiff's attorneys.

Divorce has been granted in the district court in the case of Mary Lamoreaux vs. Harry L. Lamoreaux. Plaintiff was given custody of her children. A decree of divorce granted in the Ray C. Lord case.

Leavitt Stella vs Leavitt Michael E

12 Sep 1913 p5

What is divorce action has filed by Mrs. Stella Leavitt vs. Michael E. Leavitt. The couple married at Creston, in 1901, and have one minor child. Plaintiff alleges non-support and inhuman treatment, and asks for custody of the child, and suitable maintenance. T. A. Thompson appears for Mrs. Leavitt.

Long Thomas D vs Long Vesta

A decree of divorce has been granted in the district court in the case of Thomas D. Long vs. Vesta Long.

Mack Gertrude vs Mack Peter 16 Dec 1913 p6

MRS. MACK ASKS DIVORCE
An action has been filed in district court by Mrs. Gertrude Mack, asking that she be granted a decree of divorce, the custody of her four minor children, \$500 attorney's fees, and \$50 per month alimony. In her complaint Mrs. Mack claims that her husband, Peter Mack, has been guilty of cruel and inhuman treatment. She also alleges that she and her husband jointly accumulated and own a 160 acre farm, valued at \$5500, and personal property to the extent of \$2000. She states that he is employed in Butte and admits that he has sent her some money, but has not kept strict account of this; that she had remained at home and managed the farm, doing considerable manual labor herself, but that her husband is dissatisfied with her efforts in this respect.

McCarthy Dennis vs McCarthy Ellen 28 Mar 1913 p8

Dennis McCarthy has instituted divorce proceedings against his wife, Ellen McCarthy. T. D. Long is attorney for the plaintiff.

McGovern Mabel vs McGovern Bernard 24 Sep 1913 p8

Complaint in a divorce action has been filed by Mrs. Mabel McGovern against Bernard McGovern. The couple were married in this city in January, 1911, and desertion and non-support are charged by the plaintiff.

2 Dec 1913 p8

On the ground of desertion a decree of divorce has been granted to Mrs. Mable McGovern from her former husband, Bernard McGovern.

Meyers Vasti vs Meyers Edward 31 Jan 1913 p8

HEARING OF DIVORCE.
Next Monday morning at 10 o'clock is the time set for the hearing of the divorce case of Vasthi Meyers vs. Edward Meyers. The charges set forth by the plaintiff are revolting and tell of brutal treatment and threats to take her life, made by the defendant. The Meyers family live in the lower valley near Somers and came to the Flathead about a year ago from Missouri.
The plaintiff asks for temporary alimony of \$100 per month, the custody of her three minor children, a just share of property valued at \$20,000, \$500 for costs of suit and \$1,000 attorneys fees. Thompson and Stout are conducting the case for the plaintiff.

Mitton Gertrude vs Mitton John J 9 Dec 1913 p5

A divorce action entitled Gertrude Mitton vs. John J. Mitton has been filed in district court. The plaintiff in her complaint alleges that she and the defendant were married in this city December 20, 1911, and that he deserted her on November 24, 1912. There are two small children of which the mother asks the custody.

Nelson Gertie vs Nelson Otis 11 Aug 1913 p8

Complaint in a divorce action was filed August 9 by Gertie Nelson against Otis Nelson, desertion being charged. The couple were married in this city in April 1911*. Mrs. Nelson asks that her former name, Gertie Foss, be restored.

Neville Susie vs Neville Charles F

18 Aug 1913 p3

Action for divorce was begun in the district court last Saturday by Susie Neville, against Charles F. Neville, by whom she was married in December, 1908, and who she alleges to have resided at Jessup since then. The grounds for divorce are cruel and inhuman treatment. The custody of two minor children is asked by the plaintiff, with \$25 per month alimony and \$50 for attorney's fees.

Proctor Allea M vs Proctor Hanson S

5 Sep 1913 p8

A divorce action entitled Allea M. Proctor vs. Hanson S. Proctor has been filed in district court. The complaint states that the couple were married in November, 1896, and alleges cruel and inhuman treatment on the part of the defendant. The couple have four minor children, of which Mrs. Proctor asks the custody. The plaintiff claims that her husband is worth in the neighborhood of \$15,000, and asks that she be granted an allowance of \$75 per month for the support of herself and children; also \$250 attorney's fees.

Rose Loretta vs Rose Frank

23 Jul 1913 p5

Complaint filed in court yesterday by Loretta Rose claims desertion as a cause for legal separation from her husband, Frank Rose. The couple were married in Bonners Ferry, February 7, 1912. W. T. McKeown appears for the plaintiff.

Schaefer Lou vs Schaefer Agnes E

19 Sep 1913 p3

Complaint in a divorce action was filed in district court September 18 by Lou Schaefer against Agnes E. Schaefer. The couple were married in this city March, 1907, and the plaintiff alleges that his wife deserted him without just cause at their home in Karoka in September of that year.

Shelley Mary vs Shelley John D

26 Dec 1913 p5

Extreme cruelty is the grounds for divorce in an action filed by Mrs. Mary Shelley against John D. Shelley. The plaintiff states that she was married to Shelley in the state of Missouri in 1892. She asks divorce and the custody of two minor children, Irene, aged 15 and Harry, aged 9. The complaint states that a settlement of community property has been effected out of court. Thomas D. Long appears for Mrs. Shelley.

Slover Flossie vs Harrow Frank

31 Jan 1913 p8

In the district court this week, the recent marriage of Flossie Slover to Frank Harrow was dissolved, the action being brought by the father of the girl. Both the bride and groom are not of age and had not the consent of their parents.

Squires Hazel S vs Squires Winnifred F

21 May 1913 p8

Complaints in two actions for divorce have been filed in the district court. Maggie S. Flynn vs. John W. Flynn, and Hazel S. Squires vs. Winnifred F. Squires are the titles of the cases. Desertion is named as the cause of the complaint in both instances.

Stevens Mary vs Stevens Jesse M

10 Oct 1913 p5

A divorce was granted to Mrs. Mary Stevens from Jesse M. Stevens. The defendant did not appear in court. James of Whitefish appeared as sheriff.

Stewart Geneva A vs Stewart Robert S

21 Jul 1913 p5

Geneva A. Stewart vs. Robert S. Stewart is the title of a divorce action filed July 18. The Stewarts were married at the Holy Family mission, in Teton county, May 8, 1903. Mrs. Stewart alleges nonsupport and asks the custody of three minor children, claiming that her husband is not a fit person, on account of dissolute habits. Noffsinger & Walchli appear for the plaintiff.

Sween Marilou vs Sween Olaf J

31 Jan 1913 p5

Marilou Sween was yesterday granted a divorce from Olaf J. Sween, her maiden name of Wright being restored.

Tetley Charlotte T vs Tetley William R

6 Jun 1913 p8

Charlotte T. Tetley vs. William R. Tetley is the title of a divorce action filed in district court yesterday. The complaint states that the couple were married in Fort Worth, Texas, in March, 1908. Desertion is charged, and the plaintiff asks that she be granted the custody of her child, Lloyd Tetley, who is now four years old.

Thomas Hazel vs Thomas Harold

25 Jul 1913 p5

In a complaint filed July 23 Hazel Thomas asks for a legal separation from her husband Harold Thomas, cruel and inhuman treatment being charged. The plaintiff alleges that Thomas beat and choked her, and used vile and abusive language in addressing her at sundry and diverse times during their wedded life. She asks the court to grant her the custody of her two minor children, as she claims the father is not fit person to have the care of them. J. E. Rockwood appears for Mrs. Thomas.

**S. J. WATT ASKS
ANNULMENT OF MARRIAGE**
An action to annul the marriage of Samel J. Watt to Rose B. Hoftell or Rose B. Watt, was filed in district court today.
In his complaint Watt alleges that at the time of his marriage, Mrs. Watt was then the legal wife of Leon Hoftell, to whom she was married in Wisconsin in 1890, she having failed to go through the formality of securing a divorce from husband No. 1. Watt's marriage occurred in Cutbank in November, 1908, and he and the defendant lived together as man and wife until December, 1911 when he discovered that she was already the wife of another man.

**MARRIAGE IS ANNULLED;
DEFENDANT FAILS TO APPEAR**
A decree annulling the marriage of Samuel J. Watt to Rose B. Watt, or more properly speaking, to Rose B. Hoftell, was granted in district court on December 9, the defendant failing to appear. Watt was married to Mrs. Hoftell in Cutbank in November, 1908, although at that time she was already the wife of Leon Hoftell, to whom she was married in Wisconsin in 1896, the marriage still being in force and effect at the time she married Watt. Husband No. 2 did not discover the true state of affairs until December, 1911, when he left the woman, and brought suit to annul his marriage a few weeks ago.
