PIONEER PASSES AWAY AT MISSOURI SANITORIUM

Charles A. Lynch, pioneer Flat-head county ranchman, died yesterday at the Nichols Sanitorium at Savannah, Missouri. This information was contained in a telegram to Mr. Lynch's brother-in-law, John F. Nowlan of this city.

Mr. Lynch had been in ill health for some time, and went east November 20 in the hope of securing relief. The body will be returned to Kalispell for burial.

He was one of the earliest settlers in Pleasant Valley, and had his ranch established there before the coming of the railroad. He sold this property to Frank Porter about five years ago, at which time he acquired the Porter ranch in the Lower Valley, where he has since made his home.

Mr. Lynch has many friends in the valley who will regret to hear of his death.
