Earl Nelson, young Great Northern employe, passed away suddenly Saturday morning at his home in Whitefish. His wife and son, Earl, were in the east visiting relatives and he met death alone. He was 33 years of age.

Mr. Nelson had been suffering with chronic nephritis, for many years, but had apparently been as well as usual recently and on Friday had been up and around as usual.

He was discovered at noon Friday by a Great Northern call, boy who went to his home to summon him for duty, and found him lying on-the floor boside a chair, his trous-ers, a brush, and an unlighted eigar-etto beside him.

Coroner Campbell was called and with the chief of police of White-fish and some of Mr. Nelson's relatives, made an investigation. It was found that Mr. Nelson evidently had got out of bed, put on some of his clothes and tried to light a clgarette, and had then picked up his trousers and walked out into the front room. Apparently he had just raised the window shades when the fatal attack came. An open box of aspirin tablets on the dresser indicated he had been in prim. Neighbors who knew Mr. Nelson porsonally stated that he had been unable to obtain_life insurance because of his physical condition.

Mrs. Nelson will arrive on train No. 1 tonight and funeral services will be conducted Tucsday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock in the Methodist church in Whitefish, Rev. Ruben Duttón efficiating. Burial will be made in the Whitefish, cemetery under the direction of Waggener and Campbell. The Masonic lodge of Whitefish will be in charge at the grave. Coroner Campbell was called and
