**Maynard S. Rygg
Gets Commission**

New York, N. Y., Oct. 28.—Maynard Sterling Rygg of 327 Ninth avenue east, Kalispell, Mont., was among the 480 ensigns commissioned today as officers in the Naval Reserve after completion of their three-months V-7 training course at the New York USNR Midshipmen's school.

The swearing-in and graduation ceremonies were conducted aboard the U.S.S. Prairie State this morning by Captain John K. Richards, U.S.N., commanding officer of the school. Captain Paul P. Blackburn, U.S.N., personnel officer and director of naval reserve, was the commencement speaker.

The New York school, which Ensign Rygg attended, now has 2,600 midshipmen preparing for commissions, making it second only to Annapolis as a training center for naval officers.

After a short leave, Ensign Rygg will report to his new post, which was not revealed.
