"There are quite a few natives working in the kitchen. Give them a cigarette and a can of bully beef and they are satisfied. Speaking of the kitchen, we are getting darned good chow—fresh meat once a day, and oven fresh bread now and then.

"We have a nice area here. Are camped close to the jungle, and if you care to look for them there are coconuts and banana trees, but the bananas are a little green yet.

"Our ex-commanding officer was made a Brigadier General. He sure deserved it. All the fellows I've seen are looking well. Archie Roe came over to see us. He is doing all right, and is a master sergeant now. All the fellows are fine, and I am O.K."
