He said he is in good shape although the Japs aren't as they had finished cleaning them up two days ago. He said he would write soon. The card was dated November 27, 1943.

6 Oct 1943 pg 4

Technical Sergeant Orville Isakson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Erling Isakson of Kalspell, spent a few days' furlough with the home folks. He is stationed at Camp Cooke, California, and is with the medical corps.

6 Oct 1943 pg 4

Mrs. Erling Isakson received word from her son, Sgt. Orville E. Isakson. He is now in North Africa.

Isch Harry 15 Mar 1943 pg 4

Word was received from Private Gilbert Sheldon under date of January 3, 1943, that a package sent him by the Egan Community club, arrived on New Year's Day. He says in part, "Needless to say it was very welcome and greatly enjoyed, by myself and the rest of the crew. Bless and thank all those who had a hand in packing and mailing that swell box. Best regards to all of them."

He also said that he had seen several of the boys from around Kalspell and Whitefish, namely: Garvin Wagner, Grover Kauffman, Harry Isch, Gay Nichols, Taylor and Garver. All of them were well and all liked Hawaii fine. For some reason the letter was delayed considerably.
