GIVEN CITATION FOR
MERITORIOUS SERVICE**

Staff Sergeant Walter W. Farris, formerly of Kallispell, has received a citation for meritorious service in the North African theater of operations, according to word received by his mother, Mrs. Walter H. Farris, of Kallispell. With the aid of a fellow soldier, he designed and constructed a time interval device to be used with the link-predictor in calculating plots for firing at unseen aircraft.

The device was constructed from enemy materials, including an Italian phonograph motor and a German telephone cable and has increased plotting accuracy and removed the guesswork from prediction firing, the citation states.

The citation was issued by command of General Eisenhower.
