Washington, Dec. 21.—The War Department today announced the names of eight Montana soldiers wounded in action in a list of 2,845 casualties. The casualties occurred in the European area.

The report follows prior notification to next of kin.

Included in the group are: Staff Sgt. James A. Johnson, sister, Mrs. Myrtle Saverud, Kalispell; Pfc. Manley J. Gaede, son of Mrs. Bertha L. Gaede of Somers; Pfc. Jackson A. Gregg, son of Earl Gregg of Whitefish.
