Mr. and Mrs. C. S. Allison of 765 North Main Street, have received a telegram from the War department advising them of the death of their son, Sanford Ray Allison, who died of wounds received on Okinawa on May 13.

He entered the service in September, 1944, and left for overseas in February, 1945. He landed on Okinawa early in May, and his parents received a letter from him dated May 3.

He attended the local schools, graduating from the Flathead county high school, and would have been 19 on May 19.

An older brother, Jack Allison, is also on Okinawa, and a sister, Alene, a senior cadet nurse in training at Warm Springs.
