J. Harrington Edwards, a former well known Kallispell business man, passed away early Monday at Seattle. This information was contained in a telegram from Mrs. Edwards to E. S. Dickey.

Mr. Edwards came to Kallispell as secretary of the Kallispell Townsite company in 1892 and afterward was connected with the Conrad National Bank in the capacity of vice president. Later he was one of the organizers of the Northwestern Mutual Fire Insurance Association of Seattle, and has made his home in that city since. He was also financial agent of the Conrad Estate, and he and Mrs. Edwards often returned for short periods. They had many friends among the older residents of Kallispell, who will regret to hear of Mr. Edwards' passing.

Mrs. Edwards stated that the funeral will be private, and requested that no flowers be sent.
