IS KILLED IN ACTION**

Staff Sergeant Norbert A. Hans of Redding, California, a former resident of Flathead county, has been killed in action, the War Department has notified his sisters, Mrs. Laurene Alcares and Mrs. Wilma Rowlan. He was an aerial gunner and bombardier with the Ninth Air Force.

He enlisted in the Army Air Forces in August, 1942, left for England in June, 1943, and served as an aviation armorer in England for 11 months before joining the Ninth Air Force as a bomber and crew member.

He was wounded in June, 1944, and awarded the Purple Heart, the Air Medal, Silver Cluster and two Bronze Clusters. He had completed 60 missions over France and Germany.

As a boy Sergeant Hans attended the Pine Grove school north of Kallispell.

Joseph Holmquist, 16, who was critically wounded in a gunshot accident late Friday afternoon, died Saturday morning at the local hospital. The youth was the son of Mr. and Mrs. T. D. Holmquist.

At the time of the accident, Harold Holmquist, 18, a cousin of the victim, was loading a .46 caliber revolver at his home, 1327 Seventh street west. The gun was an old model which had no trigger and was being loaded by holding back the hammer. It fired as Joseph walked in front of Harold and the bullet passed through his neck. He was taken to the hospital at once but little hope was held for him last night.

Officers investigated the scene and discovered that the bullet had lodged in a cabinet across the room. At the time the accident occurred, the victim's older brother, Paul, and his cousins, Mildred and Harold, were present.

Besides the parents, four brothers and six sisters survive young Holmquist.
