### POLSON HUNTER IS KILLED IN SOUTH FORK GUN MISHAP

Carl Meiers of Polson died late Monday afternoon as a result of a gunshot wound in the pelvis which he sustained while hunting in the woods near Elk Park on the South Fork of the Flathead river. Details of the accident are not known here as yet but Coroner Harry Campbell and Deputy Royal Hopkins are investigating the circumstances. The accident occurred about 37 miles from the Coram Ranger station. Mr. Meiers is 24 years old and his father is a photographer in Polson.

### Meiers Shot When Mistaken For Elk By Eureka Hunter

Carl Meiers of Polson was accidentally shot by J. Alfred Peltier of Eureka about 10 o'clock Monday morning, and died of his wound within an hour, according to Coroner H. H. Campbell, who with Deputy Sheriff Royal Hopkins, investigated the accident.

The accident occurred 22 miles this side of the Spotted Bear ranger station, and 12 miles from the highway on a side road leading into the mountains.

The hunting party of which Peltier was a member had camped at the Quiltankin cabins, driven up the side road, and then followed a trail four miles over Bald ridge, where the accident occurred.

Peltier informed the officers that

he was following the trail of an elk around the shoulder of a mountain, and saw what he took to be an elk 150 yards ahead. There was considerable timber and brush, and Peltier said he thought he saw the antlers of an elk when he fired. When he discovered he had shot another hunter by mistake he signalled Allen S. Erickson of Eureka, his hunting companion, who ran back the four miles to his car, and drove to Felix creek, where he telephoned for the ambulance.

Meiers was 28 years of age, and leaves a widow and two children. The body was brought out, and has been taken to Polson. Meiers and Peltier were in different hunting parties and Peltier was not aware there were other hunters in the vicinity.

Coroner Campbell says there will probably be no inquest, as it was evident the shooting was purely accidental.

Coroner Campbell, Deputy Hopkins, and Charles Weller of the Fire Department, who drove the ambulance, went in Monday evening, but were unable to make their way over the trail at night, and remained at the Quiltankin camp till morning. They did not return until after 4 o'clock Tuesday.
