Neil C. Parker, Prominent Valley Citizen, Is Called

The people of Flathead county were greatly shocked to learn of the death of Neil C. Parker, which occurred at his home near Bigfork Monday evening.

Mr. Parker had been in his usual health during the recent legislative session, but had suffered attacks of acute indigestion since coming home. His death came without warning at about 7:30 last evening.

He was born at Paterson, Iowa, Oct. 30, 1891, and was educated in the public schools of Spencer, Iowa. He came to Flathead county in April 1910, and has made his home here ever since. He was one of the best known residents of Flathead county, and has served as representative in the state legislature since 1929, with the exception of one term in 1937. He was the oldest member of the house in point of service.

With his brother, Sam Parker, he has operated a successful seed farm near Bigfork for many years. A novel feature of the place is an overhead irrigating system, operated by an electric power plant which Neil Parker had himself constructed. He frequently spent months visiting agricultural colleges in various western states to acquaint himself with the new varieties of plants and the latest developments in seed production.
