# ACCIDENTAL GUN DISCHARGE FATAL TO REDLINGSHAFER

**John Redlingshafer Almost Instantly Killed When Automatic Rifle, In Hands Of His Father, Paul, Fires During Loading Process**

The second fatal accident of the hunting season occurred about 6:30 Thursday evening when John W. Redlingshafer was shot by his father, Paul Redlingshafer, dying almost instantly.

During the afternoon John Redlingshafer, who is employed by the Wilson Produce Company, drove a truck to Rexford, accompanied by his father. Returning they stopped near the old Redlingshafer place seven miles northwest of Kalispell, where they intended to hunt. Mr. Redlingshafer took a gun, a .32-caliber Winchester automatic rifle, from the rear of the truck and was attempting to load it, when it was accidentally discharged, killing his son, who was sitting in the cab of the truck. Three bullets struck him, one in the lungs, one in the abdomen, and one in the leg, causing almost instantaneous death. Mr. Redlingshafer was unable to explain what caused the gun to be discharged, according to Coroner H. H. Campbell.

John Redlingshafer was 32 years of age, and leaves a widow and three small children, the eldest seven years of age, and the youngest a baby of 14 months. Their home is near the Evergreen School house on the County airport road.

Coroner Campbell says no inquest will be held.
