William L. Taylor was found dead at his home in Bigfork Monday morning. Men working for him on house construction made a search when Mr. Taylor failed to show up for the job Monday morning. He was 52 years of age and was feeling ill Sunday evening. Death was due to natural causes, according to Coroner Harry H. Campbell and Mr. Taylor apparently died late Sunday night as he was preparing to retire. He was a veteran of World War I and formerly lived in Great Falls, spending the past two summers near Bigfork. His wife in Great Falls has been notified and service arrangements will be announced later by the Waggener & Campbell Funeral home.
