Mrs. Melvin Combs has received a citation of honor awarded her son, Sgt. Donald Combs. This was awarded for his participation in the super-fortress attack of the 29th air force against Nagoya, Japan, on April 7, 1945. Sgt. Combs was reported missing since this date and has since been declared dead, as of April 8, 1946.

Sgt. Combs graduated from Filthead County High school in the spring of 1943 and entered the service the following June. He re-

ceived his training at Scott Field, Illinois and Pratt, Kansas.

Before being sent overseas, his squadron was sent on a mission to Cuba and later of Puerto Rico.

He went overseas in February, 1945, and was based on Guam. It was from this base that his mission left on April 7, 1945.

Sgt. Combs is survived by his mother, three brothers and three sisters, all of this locality.
