CPL. HARRY GIES IS DISCHARGED FROM U. S. MARINE CORPS

Cpl. Harry Gies of the United States Marines was honorably discharged Jan. 24, 1946 at San Diego, Calif. He had served a four-year enlistment and has received his hash mark. He enlisted at Butte, Jan. 13, 1942, and took boot training at San Diego. He shipped overseas in Aug., 1942 and returned on Sept. 6, 1944. He served in the Asiatic-Pacific area, Efate, Guadalcanal, Palmyra and the Hawaiian Islands and participated in operations at Bougainville and the consolidation of the northern Solomons.

Cpl. Gies earned the good conduct medal, the presidential unit citation with star, campaign bars of the Asiatic-Pacific, American theater of war and victory bar.

He has been stationed at the marine air corps station "El Toro" Santa Ana, Calif., as an aviation armorer since Nov., 1944. With him has been his wife, the former Myrtle Moon and their baby daughter Frances Kay. The couple with their baby will return to Montana early this summer.

The local office has received some changes in policy which are: Men who have been honorably discharged from active service (or released under honorable conditions) on or after May 12, 1945, may, provided enlistment is accomplished on or before June 30, 1946, be enlisted in the grade for which qualified by MOS number. There are many MOS numbers of which the army desires to fill as soon as possible. Effective July 1, 1946, men who enlist for three years within three months from the date of last satisfactory active service, may be enlisted in the grade for which qualified under these provisions. Applicants for enlistment under the provisions will not be enlisted in a grade higher than that held by the applicant at the time of his discharge from active service. The provisions are too numerous to publish but the recruiting office at the post office building will be glad to explain to anyone interested.
