Men who have been honorably discharged from active service (or released under honorable conditions) on or after May 12, 1945, may, provided enlistment is accomplished on or before June 30, 1946, be enlisted in the grade for which qualified by MOS number. There are many MOS numbers of which the army desires to fill as soon as possible. Effective July 1, 1946, men who enlist for three years within three months from the date of last satisfactory active service, may be enlisted in the grade for which qualified under these provisions. Applicants for enlistment under the provisions will not be enlisted in a grade higher than that held by the applicant at the time of his discharge from active service. The provisions are too numerous to publish but the recruiting office at the post office building will be glad to explain to anyone interested.
