Harry Waldo Pierson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Pierson of Kallispell, has officially been declared dead by the navy, the parents have learned. He was an aviation machinist's mate, second class, and was reported missing March 9, 1944.

The parents were informed that all the personnel from the B-24 plane were lost on a flight from Munda, on that date. No trace of the plane was found when a searching party set out. It was from the squadron VB 104 that had been at Guadalcanal.

A.M.M. Pierson enlisted December 7, 1941, after graduating from Flathead County High School. He left for training on Christmas of that year. Hope still is held for him by the parents who have learned that the navy is instigating a huge program to search for the many men who are missing.
