MARINE LIEUTENANT C. B. ARONOW HERE TO ENLIST RESERVISTS

First Lieutenant C. B. Aronow, reserve officer, of the U. S. Marine Corps, is here today on his itinerary of the state in the interest of recruiting for the Marine Corps reserve.

Lieutenant Aronow says that he can accept only discharged Marines, not drawing any disability benefits. Those who are eligible will be appointed to the same rank they held on discharge and will be transferred to the inactive reserve. No training duty is required, and they may go to camp two weeks of each year if they wish. Time and grade in the Reserve, he says, counts on longevity if they are ever called up.

Lieutenant Aronow is registered at the Montana Hotel and will be here until Monday when he will leave for Missoula.
