**EX-MARINE, WM. DAVIS, ENLISTS IN REGULAR ARMY FOR JAPAN DUTY**

The U. S. Army Recruiting station located at the post office building, today announced that William W. Davis, 24 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. John W. Davis, Big Fork ranchers, enlisted in the regular army at Butte, Montana on May 29 for duty in Japan with the Famous 11th Airborne Division.

Davis served in the Marine Corps during the War and wears on his Asiatic-Pacific Theater Ribbon, three bronze stars for participation in operations against the enemy on Saipan, Tinian and Okinawa—Ryukyus Islands. He also wears the American Theater Ribbon, the Victory Ribbon and the Ribbon for Occupation of Japan. He served with the occupying forces in Japan from September to December, 1945. Until recently, Davis worked as a cook with the Merchant Marine.

Davis expressed his reason for joining the Army as desiring to take advantage of the career, training and travel advantages offered.
