**CAPT. JOHN SLOAN OF BELTON KILLED IN ARMY BOMBER CRASH**

Tokyo, June 2.—(AP)—General headquarters tonight announced the names of 46 persons killed Thursday night when a four-engined army courier plane inbound from Korea crashed on a mountainside 30 miles southwest of Tokyo.

The casualties—there were no survivors—included 36 military personnel and four civilians, one of them Philip A. Adler, foreign correspondent for the Detroit News.
