**EVERETT A. WILLETTE,
S 1/C, LOSES ARM IN
SHIPBOARD ACCIDENT**

Mrs. Alixia Willette of R.F.D. 5-B (Calianell) has been advised by the navy that her son, Everett, lost his right arm in a shipboard accident recently.

Some of the details of the mishap are revealed in the following communication sent to Mrs. Willette by Admiral Sprague.

"A report just received shows your son, Everett Alixia (better known as Johnny) Willette, seaman first class USN, accidentally had his right arm amputated at shoulder while cleaning an extractor in the laundry of his ship on April 7. His condition is serious. Your anxiety is appreciated and you will be furnished details when received. You are assured he is receiving the best possible medical care and I join in the wish for his speedy recovery.
