Col. Horn Takes Part In Air Troop Movement

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. — Lt. Col. John D. Horn, nephew of Miss Mary R. Horn of 219 Dakota Ave., Whitefish, Mont., took part in the recent 10,000 mile airlift of 101st Airborne Division units to Vietnam — the largest and longest aerial troop deployment in history.

Col. Horn, an aircraft commander, flew aboard one of the Military Airlift Command (MAC) transports that airlifted units of the 101st — the famed Screaming Eagles — from Ft. Campbell, Ky., to Vietnam.

The deployment — dubbed Operation Eagle Thrust — began Nov. 17. MAC C-141 Starlifters and C-130 Cargomasters carried more than 19,000 troops and some 5,000 tons of equipment during the giant airlift.

Col. Horn is a member of the 63rd Military Airlift Wing at Norton AFB, Calif.

The World War II veteran was commissioned through the aviation cadet program.

A graduate of Whitefish High School he received his degree in meteorology in 1948 from the University of California at Los Angeles.
