USS TICONDEROGA (FH7NC) — Signalman Second Class Ernest J. Jernberg, USN, son of Ernest E. Jernberg of Rte. 1A, Kallispell, Mont., and husband of the former Miss Patricia J. Anderson of 850 W. Frontage Road, Imperial Beach, Calif., is serving aboard the U.S. Seventh Fleet attack aircraft carrier USS Ticonderoga off the coast of North Vietnam.

The mission of the Ticonderoga is to stop the flow of enemy war supplies along routes from North to South Vietnam. In order to accomplish this, aircraft embarked on the carrier fly daily bombing missions and provide close air support for U.S. and Allied ground forces engaged in combat operations.

Jernberg Now Serving On Ticonderoga

USS TICONDEROGA at sea. — Signalman 2nd Ernest J. Jernberg, USN, son of Mr. Ernest E. Jernberg of Rt. 1A, Kallispell, is at Subic Bay, P.I. aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Ticonderoga.

The Ticonderoga went to Subic Bay following 35 days "on the line" in the Gulf of Tonkin off the coast of North Vietnam.

While in the Gulf planes from the carrier flew more than 700 air strikes in support of U.S. and Allied ground forces operating in South Vietnam.

The Ticonderoga is the first carrier to return to Vietnam for a fourth tour of duty.

Jernberg's Ship Completes Fourth Tour In Far East

USS TICONDEROGA at sea (FH7NC) — Signalman Second Class Ernest J. Jernberg, USN, 22, son of Mr. Ernest E. Jernberg of Rt. 1, Kallispell, Mont., and husband of the former Miss Patricia J. Anderson of 850 W. Frontage Road, Imperial Beach, Calif., has just completed a six-month deployment in the Gulf of Tonkin off the coast of North Vietnam aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Ticonderoga.

As a crewmember, he helped to provide air support to U.S. and Allied ground forces ashore in South Vietnam. He also helped to provide the necessary support to the squadron of Air Wing 19 so that they could fly combat missions against the enemy.

When Ticonderoga completed her latest deployment, she became the first carrier to have completed four tours of duty on Yankee Station. The Ticonderoga is homeported in San Diego.

Kalispell Man Aboard USS Ticonderoga

LONG BEACH, CALIF. (FH7NC) — Signalman Second Class Ernest J. Jernberg, USN, 22, son of Mr. Ernest E. Jernberg of Rt. 1, Kallispell, Mont., and husband of the former Patricia J. Anderson, Imperial Beach, Calif., is serving aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Ticonderoga at Long Beach, Calif.

Ticonderoga received its third Navy Unit Commendation award for action during its fourth combat cruise with the Seventh Fleet off the coast of Vietnam.

While deployed, Ticonderoga launched air attacks against enemy defenses in Vietnam. The carrier also acted in support of U. S. and Allied ground forces at Khe Sanh and other embattled areas in the five northernmost provinces of South Vietnam.

The San Diego-based carrier is the first attack carrier to complete four combat missions off the coast of Vietnam and has received three Navy Unit Commendations in four years.
