BROADUS (AP) — A 19-year-old Broadus area youth was killed late Friday night in a one-car accident 16 miles southeast of here on a county road.

The Montana Highway Patrol identified the victim as Gary Mahoney.

The patrol also said another youth, Harry Deitchler, 19, was seriously injured and hospitalized in Miles City.

The patrol said Mahoney's car missed a turn and slammed into a ditch.

The death raised Montana's highway death toll to 227 for the year, compared with 230 on Sept. 5 last year.

GREAT FALLS — John A. Makela, 63, West Glacier, died at 10:45 a.m. Saturday at Columbus Hospital, Great Falls.

He was fatally injured in a single vehicle accident at 9:30 p.m. Thursday when his car crashed into the abutment of Abbott Creek bridge just east of Martin City on U.S. 2.

Makela was evacuated from the North Valley Hospital Friday morning by air ambulance. Doctors had hopes his condition had taken a turn for the better. He was considered very critical at all stages of treatment. He survived the air journey by 24 hours.

Makela is Flathead County's fourth highway traffic victim of 1970. His death snaps a skein of less than two weeks which had been compiled in the local area. In Northwest Montana he is now the 11th victim in the tri-county area.

He is survived at the family home by his wife and a sister and other relatives. Service arrangements are indefinite at this time.

The Montana Highway Patrol credited Virgil Lane as the first man on the scene within moments after it happened as assisting Makela and keeping his head out of the waters of Abbott Creek after the car caromed off the bridge and landed on its top in the creek.

At Great Falls pathologists attributed Makela's death to crushing chest injuries and other internal injuries. The patrol is still continuing its investigation. An inquest is not likely.

Mr. Managhan died April 5, 1969.

Requiem mass will be said by the Rev. James R. DeGroat, of Polson at 11 a.m. tomorrow. Burial will be in Lakeview Cemetery in Polson under the direction of the Shrider Funeral Home of Ronan.

Mr. McDonald is survived by his widow, the former Dorothy Schomer of Kalispell; four daughters, Ann Marie, Marguerite, Katherine and Christine; his mother, Annie McDonald of Hot Springs; and two brothers, Angus Jr. and Tom, both of Niarada.

Mr. McDonald was the grandson of Angus McDonald, Scottish fur trader who in 1847 established the Hudson's Bay post known as Fort Connah at Post Creek, midway between the present towns of Ronan and St. Ignatius.

He attended grade school in

Lonepine, near Niarada, where his parents ranched. He enrolled in Haskell Institute, Lawrence, Kan., in 1927, and completed high school there. While at Haskell Institute, he became the only high school boy to play a full football game against Notre Dame. Haskell teams at that time included players from high school, business college and trade schools.

During the 1930s he played for the University of Montana Grizzlies under Doug Fessenden, and later played professional football for Los Angeles, Phoenix, and Cleveland.

Mr. McDonald was a World War II veteran, having served in the South Pacific. He was a leader in 4-H Club work, raised registered Hereford cattle, and had been a member of the Salish-Kootenai Housing Authority.
