

# Neal Umholtz, 65

Neal O. Umholtz, 65, 221 O'Brien Ave., died in Whitefish Friday afternoon.

Umholtz was born Feb. 15, 1912 in Hot Springs, a son of Orié and Pearl Umholtz.

He received his education in Hot Springs, in 1931 he moved to San Francisco and acquired a position as manager in the Lucky Food Stores. In 1936 he moved to Berkeley and then later to East Oakland. During WWII he was a pilot for the Royal Canadian Air Force in Canada. In 1946, he moved to Ronan where he became part owner in the Mint Bar. He moved to Whitefish in 1954, where he

was employed as a bartender at the Cadillac Bar until his retirement in 1975.

He was active in various organizations in Whitefish, especially the Lion Club.

Umholtz was married to Iris Campbell Oct. 8, 1933, in San Francisco and is now survived by her at the family home in Whitefish. He is also survived by two daughters, Mrs. Ray (Sonia) Smith of Conrad and Mrs. John (Sydney) Newbauer of Miles City; one sister Mrs. Frank (Sally) Hermanson of San Francisco, Calif.; and four grandchildren.

Services for Umholtz will be Monday at 2 p.m. in the Austin Chapel. Dr. David V. Kauffman of the Central Christian Church of Whitefish will officiate. Cremation will follow the services. The family suggest memorials to the organization of their choice.
