WHITEFISH — Sheriff Al Rierson has identified the Whitefish man who drowned Thursday night on Upper Whitefish Lake as Larry Dale Murphy, 30.

Murphy had been camping with five other Flathead Valley residents at the shore of the lake about 15 miles north of Olney when the accident occurred around 9:30 p.m., Rierson said.

Murphy had been canoeing or fishing when he stepped into deep water and could not swim out. His friends pulled him out of the water and gave him artificial respiration but were unable to revive him.

Murphy was born Oct. 20, 1949, in Whitefish, a son of Morris and Eileen Murphy. He received his schooling in Whitefish and graduated in the class of 1968.

After high school, he enlisted in the Marine Corps and served four years. He returned to Whitefish after his honorable discharge and worked for the U.S. Forest Service for six years.

Murphy, who was single, was employed by the Big Mountain Corp.

He is survived by his father, Morris of Whitefish and his mother, Mrs. Eileen Schulstad of Kalispell; two sisters, Mrs. Richard (Connie) Gage of Whitefish and Mrs. Marlo (Cheryl) Dull of Columbia Falls; and his grandmother, Mrs. Hannah Mitchell of Spokane, Wash.
