Rollin Quinn, 92, died Friday, April 17, at Kalispell Regional Medical Center.

He was born Aug. 14, 1905, in Waterville, Kansas, to James and Annie Quinn. He was fourth of six children born to this farming family.

When he was 10, his mother died. He left school after the eighth grade to work on the farm.

He served as principal of a grade school in Oxford, Kansas, for six years. During World War II, he worked for Beach Aircraft in Wichita. After the war, the family moved to Leavenworth, where he taught high school math and physics. After retiring there, he taught five more years

He taught continuing education for six years at Leavenworth Federal Prison.

He and his wife, Velma, owned and operated a drive-in movie theater. They were active in the Methodist Church. In 1981, they moved to Kalispell to be close to their children, Lil Laidlaw, who taught nursing at the University of Kansas, and Buzz Quinn, an FVCC mathematic instructor. He taught and tutored at Flathead Valley Community College until he was 88.

He moved to Immanuel Lutheran home in April.

He was preceded in death by two sisters and a brother.

He is survived by his wife, Velma Quinn, of Kalispell; daughter Lil and her husband, Dr. James T. Laidlaw, of Kalispell, and son Buzz Quinn, of Kalispell. He has three grandchildren and four great grandchildren.
