Plaintiff for her cause of action alleges her residence in Montana for more than one year immediately preceding the commencement of this action, her marriage to defendant at Missoula, Montana, November 21, 1910; that defendant was on or about the — day of January, 1912, convicted of a felony, to-wit: Of feloniously introducing intoxicating liquor into the Flathead Indian reservation, and of feloniously selling liquor to an Indian; that defendant has wilfully neglected to provide for the plaintiff the common necessaries of life, having the ability to do so. Wherefore the plaintiff prays for a divorce from the defendant.

You are hereby summoned to answer the complaint in this action, which is filed in the office of the clerk of this court, a copy of which is herewith served upon you in the county wherein you reside, and to file your answer and serve a copy thereof upon the plaintiff's attorney within twenty days after the service of this summons, exclusive of the day of service; and in case of your failure to appear or answer, judgment will be taken against you, by default, for the relief demanded in the complaint. That this action is brought by the plaintiff against said defendant for the purpose of obtaining a decree of divorce in the above entitled court, dissolving the bands of matrimony heretofore and now existing between said plaintiff and said defendant, on the grounds of the non-support or wilful neglect of this plaintiff by said defendant, as alleged in said complaint, for a period of more than one year immediately last past and preceding the commencement of this action, to provide for this plaintiff the common necessities of life or to in any manner assist her in obtaining the same because of his idleness, profligacy and dissipation. It is further alleged in said complaint: That said plaintiff and defendant intermarried at Cambridge, county of Washington, state of Idaho, on or about the 9th day of July, 1903, and ever since have been and now are husband and wife; that said plaintiff is and has been a resident of the state of Montana for more than one year

of Montana for more than one year immediately preceding the commencement of this action, and that said defendant has been and resided within the said state of Montana, subsequent to their said intermarriage and prior to the commencement of this action; that the issue of said intermarriage consists of one minor child, namely, Geraldine Windes, and that said plaintiff asks that the care and custody of said child be awarded her by a decree of said court in this action; that the said defendant is not a fit and proper person to have the care or control of said minor child by reason of his dissipation and total disregard, abandonment and neglect of said child and said plaintiff for more than one year immediately prior to the commencement of this suit.
