




Belflaur daughter Wm 26 Dec 1890 pg 3






Clifford Jeremiah John John E 17 Oc 1890 pg 3

Evans son Burt 10 Jan 1890 pg 1




—We learn that a child was recently born to Mr. and Mrs. Joe Gangner of Half Moon.


—James Greig, is the happy father of a boy born last Sunday morning, Aug. 3rd 1890.

Hume girl Robert 5 Dec 1890 pg 3




