**DIVORCE GRANTED
MRS. CONRAD**

**CUSTODY OF CHILDREN AND THE
PROPERTY RIGHTS ADJUSTED
BEFORE CASE IS TRIED.**

Before the opening of the murder case this morning, the court heard the divorce case of Kokoa B. Conrad vs. Charles D. Conrad, and the decree was immediately granted.

In her complaint Mrs. Conrad charged the defendant with cruelty, which was denied in his answer. A stipulation adjusting the property rights of the parties to the action was also filed, and the decree was rendered practically in accord with the terms of the stipulation. In granting the decree the court provides that the plaintiff shall have the custody of the two minor children one-half the time, during which she shall support them without expense to the defendant, and that the defendant shall have them one-half the time, this provision existing until the further order of the court. It is decreed that Mrs. Conrad shall receive the home, its furnishings, shall be paid \$4,000 at once, \$3,000 before May 15, 1915, \$3,000 on or before May 15, 1916 and \$2,000 on or before May 15, 1918, and that these payments shall bear 6 per cent interest until paid.

The children are Kokoa, aged 5 and Charles Edward, who is six years old today, and it is provided that the father shall care for and educate them. Mr. and Mrs. Conrad were married in this city, March 12, 1907. G. H. Grubb appeared for the defendant and C. E. H. Malloy of Spokane, for the plaintiff. There have been rumors that the case was impending for the past six months, and it does not come altogether as a surprise to the friends of the couple.



Mrs. Ruth Maken was granted a decree of divorce by Judge Thompson yesterday, on the grounds of cruel and inhuman treatment. WIFE ALLEGES CRUELTY

Complaint in an action for divorce was filed yesterday by Mrs. Vashi Meyers, who charges her husband, Edward Meyers with cruel and inhuman treatment. The couple were married in Missouri in 1881, and have four children, two of whom are minors. Mrs. Meyers alleges that her husband kicked, struck and beat her, and even threatened to take her life. She states that although he is worth nearly \$20,000 he has given her only 85 cents for her own personal use in the past six months, and for good measure adds that he is frequently drunk, and uses profane, abusive and obscene language in the presence of the children. Mrs. Meyers claims that she and her husband have community property to the value of \$10,000, and in addition to asking for a divorce and the custody of the minor children, also requests that she be granted \$500 suit money, \$1000 attorney's fees, and \$100 per month for the support of herself and children. A divorce case occupied the attention of district court yesterday. Louise A. The plaintiff was represented by Attorneys Harlowe, of Missoula, and Hans Wahl-ehli of this city. Foot & McDonald represented the defendant, Mr. McDonald conducting the case.

Mrs. Wyble testified that she had always been compelled to do the bulk of the work around their home, and that her husband had even refused her the necessaries of life.
