**YOUNG BOY KILLED  
IN ACCIDENT  
AT MILL**

**Clothes Catch In Revolving Shaft  
And He Is Whirled To  
His Death**

Alfred Elofson, ten year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl A. Elofson of Fourth avenue east, north, was accidentally killed Saturday afternoon at the sawmill of the Kalispell Lumber company ten miles west of town.

Mr. Elofson is saw filer at the mill, and took Alfred with him in the morning when he went out to the mill, as he frequently did on Saturday. The lad was playing outside the mill and in passing between a pile of wood and the building, in some manner his clothing caught on the end of a revolving shaft that projected from the building. He was whirled violently around, his skull being crushed when his head struck a steel grease drum, and his right arm, right leg, and his collar bone were broken. All his clothing with the exception of his shoes, was stripped from his body.

No one witnessed the accident, but when the mill shut down for some repair to be made, one of the workmen discovered the body. As the boy had been seen fifteen minutes before, the accident had evidently occurred very shortly before the shutdown.

Coroner Campbell was notified of the accident, and brought the body to Kalispell.

Mr. and Mrs. Elofson have been residents of Kalispell for but a few months. Alfred was their only child.

Funeral services were held this afternoon by Rev. B. Scott Bates at the Waggener & Campbell chapel at 2 o'clock and interment was made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.
