

**SERVICES CONDUCTED
FOR ORSON D. EDENS**

Funeral services for Orson Drake Edens were held Thursday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock by Rev. G. M. Fisher, in the Waggener and Campbell chapel. Mrs. M. A. Tiffany and Mrs. John Herbenson sang "In the Sweet Bye and Bye" and "Death Is a Dream," and Arthur Driscoll rendered a helpful solo "Face to Face."

The pall bearers were Owen W. Olesen, Joe Steppler, Ray Robbin, Lee Masterson, Roy Ellis and Roy Johnston. Interment, which was not made until Saturday afternoon owing to the holding of an inquest, was in Conrad Memorial cemetery.

Orson Drake Edens was born in Ballanger, Texas, May 20, 1901, and died September 3, 1928 at the age of 27 years.

His early life was spent in Texas and Southern California. He came to Montana several years ago. Since then he had worked at various logging camps near here, where he was familiarly known as "Rastus."

He was married to Nellie Weaver July 4, 1921. Two children were born to this union, Marie Bama and a daughter who died in infancy.

Mr. Edens was one of seven children. Besides his widow and little daughter, he is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. N. S. Edens, and his brothers and sisters: Mrs. W. M. Craig, Mrs. H. Dargar Morris, John, Mildred and Glen Edens all of Los Angeles; and William Edens of the U. S. Navy.

Mr. and Mrs. Edens and daughter went to Port Arthur, Texas two years ago returning here July 16. Mr. Edens was working for the National Pole company near Coram. He moved his family there about two weeks ago.
