

## SERVICES AT COLUMBIA FALLS FOR SOLOMON LEWIS

Funeral services for Solomon W. Lewis were held Friday afternoon in the Oddfellows temple at Columbia Falls. The hall was filled to capacity, and flowers in great abundance were banked about the casket. Rev. C. M. Daley delivered the funeral address, and music was furnished by Leon Lennon, L. C. Robinson, Bernice Daley and Mrs. T. E. VanScotten, with Mrs. Margaret Patton at the piano.

The active pall-bearers were Dave Leighty, Ira Ross, William Michel, G. F. Loeffler, Bradford Leighty and Dave Sherriffs. There were also six honorary bearers from the Masonic lodge and six from the Rebeccah lodge. Interment was made in the Fairview cemetery under the direction of Waggener and Campbell.

Solomon W. Lewis was born at Elkport, Iowa, August 29, 1861, and died October 3, 1928, at the age of 67 years. He came to the Flathead over 40 years ago, settling in the Bad Rock district, where he had since lived. He was married to Anna E. Dieken in June, 1897. His wife survives him, together with five sons and three daughters. Two brothers also survive, William and Allen Lewis, of Kalispell.

Mr. Lewis was prominent in the Oddfellows lodge work, having filled many offices. He also was a member of the Masonic lodge.
