

FUNERAL SERVICES FOR ALEXANDER NORIN

Funeral services for Alexander Norin, were held yesterday morning at 10 o'clock in the Sherman & Son chapel, Rev. George McVey Fisher officiating. Mrs. M. A. Tiffany and Mrs. Charles Hooper sang "Rock of Ages," "Under His Wings," and "Death Is Only A Dream." Mrs. Fisher was the accompanist. The pall-bearers were H. G. Curtis, G. A. Brinkman, M. L. Murphy, A. L. Manning, G. A. Yanicke, C. D. O'Neil. Interment was in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.

Alexander Norin was born near Stockholm, Sweden, August 10, 1853, and came to the United States when he was 21 years of age, settling at Howard, Michigan, where he worked as a contractor and builder. He came to Kaitispell in 1909, and although his residence was not constant here, he always considered this his home. He was a member of the plasterers' union of Spokane. Mr. Norin had been in poor health all winter with a disease of the heart. He passed away at his residence 578 Second avenue east north, May 9. Surviving him are his widow, M's. Alice Norin, and two sons, Carl Norin of Seattle, Washington, and Roy A. Norin, of Grand Rapids, Michigan. The latter was here for the services but it was impossible for the other son to attend.
