EIGHTH VIOLENT DEATH IN FOUR MONTHS OCCURRED SATURDAY AFTERNOON

WILLIAM ARTHURS C WHITEFISH SHOT AND KILLED BY HIS ADOPTED SON. STATEMENT MADE THAT HE WAS BEATING HIS WIFE, AND HOWARD ARTHURS OBLIGED TO SHOOT IN SELF DEFENSE.

The eighth death by violence in Flathead county within four months occurred Saturday afternoon, when William Arthurs, who lives three miles east of Whitefish, was shot and killed by his adopted son, Howard Arthurs.

According to the story told by Howard Arthurs to Sheriff Ripke and Coroner Campbell, he was obliged to kill his foster father to save his own life. He said he and John Rude were standing outside near the barn when they heard Mrs. Arthurs scream. He rushed into the house and found his father beating his mother. A shotgun stood in one corner of the room and a rifle in an opposite corner. Howard Arthurs said that when he went to his mother's rescue, his father sprang for the shotgun, and he, in self-defense, for the rifle. He proved to be a little quicker on the draw, and the father dropped with a bullet through his chest just above the heart.

GUS AUSTIN DEAD IN SALT LAKE CITY

An Associated Press dispatch from Salt Lake City today says that Edward Augustus Austin died yesterday in that city, and there is a report to the effect that his death was due to the injury he received August 17 at Kila, when he is alleged to have struck over the head with his gun by Dan D. (Dogy) Duncan, at the time Russell and Bud Neas were shot and killed.

ARTHUR IS EXONERATED OF BLAME FOR DEATH OF HIS FOSTER FATHER

CORONER'S JURY FINDS THAT THE SHOOTING WAS JUSTIFIABLE, AND HE WAS DISCHARGED. TESTIMONY SHOWED THAT SON SHOT IN SELF-DEFENSE WHEN HE INTERFERED TO SAVE MOTHER FROM BEATING.

The coroner's jury in the inquest into the death of William Arthurs, which was held at Whitefish yesterday afternoon, completely exonerated Howard Arthurs for the slaying of his foster father last Saturday.

Howard Arthurs was the first witness called by Coroner Campbell. He said he had been working during the summer, but he said he had been away working during the summer, but he had come and gone at different times, and recently returned upon being released from jail. John Rude had also been working there recently.

For Saturday he said the father returned home about 11 a. m., after several days absence, and drove to Whitefish with the house car and sleeping in the room. He said he was left in the house for some time, and he entered the room, his father, who had his mother down on a mattress, and he was shouting for a shotgun which was leaning against the wall behind him. He then seized a rifle standing in an opposite corner and fired.

Asked by County Attorney Child if his life was in danger, he replied that he thought his father would have shot him if his mother hadn't been holding him by the arm, and that after questioning he said his father had never threatened his life, but had struck him with his fists on numerous occasions.

Henry Bose, a pioneer of the Flathead valley since Demersville days, died at the state sanitarium yesterday, according to a telephone message received from his son-in-law, H. J. Rodolf of Butte.

Mr. Bose, who was well past 80 years of age, has been in failing health for about a year, and he was recently removed to the sanitarium where he could be given better care.

He came to Demersville in 1841, and engaged in the mercantile business in Kalspell when the town was started. Afterward he was in the hide and fur business, and owned a warehouse on Railroad street. Prior to coming here he was in the mercantile business in Winnipeg at the time of the building of the Montana railroad.

He has long been prominent in Masonic affairs, and was a member of Kalspell lodge A. F. & A. M., the Royal Arch Masons, the Knights Templar and the Eastern Star. He was a past master of the Blue Lodge, and a past high priest of the Royal Arch masons.

He is survived by a son, Wilfred Bose of Columbia Falls, and two daughters, Mrs. Rodolf of Butte and Mrs. Marguerite Hall of Pomeroy, Washington.

The body of Rachel Schacko, the second victim of the drowning accident in the Stillwater river yesterday, was found about 5:30 last evening.

Searchers in a boat were dragging the river with pike poles, and found the body at the point where the girls had gone swimming yesterday afternoon. The hook of the pike pole caught in the strap of the swimming suit and the body was brought out without injury.

Carl Evenson, father of Wilda Evenson, said today that the release of storage waters in Tully lake or the Stillwater lakes was the cause of the tragedy. The day before the water had been low and it was possible for the girls to wade across the river. He was not aware that storage water had been released, which raised the river two or three feet, or he would never have allowed them to go.

Mrs. Lee Evenson, a little cousin of Wilda, went to the river with the girls, and was the only eye witness of the tragedy. She sat watching them on the high bank north of the golf course, and the first she knew anything was wrong was when Rachel sank from sight, and Wilda floated down the river calling for help.

Garner Campbell found no water in the lungs of the Evenson girl, and it his theory that she was attacked with cramps, and that Rachel Schacko lost her life in attempting to rescue her. Wilda Evenson, it is said, was a fairly good swimmer, and had crossed the river and was returning when she sank. The body of Wilda was discovered by E. L. Hopper and Ray Duffy, the latter diving in and recovering the body from a bar where it had lodged. Phil Hawding, Ruhe Melton, and two young men by the name of Franklin and Shute recovered the body of the Schacko girl.
