Raymond Waggener of Waggener & Campbell was called by the coroner of Lake county to take charge of the body.

A fatal accident occurred at the Larson logging camp Monday afternoon, when Gus Bostrom was instantly killed by a falling snag, while driving a caterpillar tractor. The community was greatly shocked and extends its sympathy to the widow, who was a bride of two months, and well known in the community, being the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Logier, of Dayton.

COMMITTS SUICIDE**

Werner, who was 80 years of age, had lived alone at the head of Whitefish lake for over 40 years, and made a living principally by hunting and trapping. He talked of suicide some years ago, but friends took his guns away from him to prevent this.

He left instructions for his burial, with sufficient money to defray the expense, with Giles Crane.

Services will be held at Whitefish tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.
