CHILD IS KILLED, PARENTS HURT AS CAR HITS TRUCK

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Daley of Somers were critically injured and their son, Donald, aged 4, was killed when their car struck a CCC truck about a mile south of Kalspell at 8:15 last evening.

Two CCC trucks were en route from Bolton to Nine Mile camp near Missoula, loaded with lumber. The drivers, Newell J. Furlong and Ronald Hobbs, had stopped to repair a headlight on the first truck and were at the extreme right side of the highway. The visibility was undoubtedly poor on account of the rain, and it is thought that possibly the lights of a car approaching from the south may have blinded Daley so that he did not see the parked trucks. The lumber extended beyond the body of the rear truck, and crashed through the windshield of Daley's car.

The little boy's head was badly crushed and he died soon after reaching the hospital. Daley was badly injured about the head, both the upper and lower jaws being fractured, and Mrs. Daley received serious chest injuries.

The car approaching from the south was driven by M. P. Barrett, of Whitefish, who went into the ditch to avoid a crash. The CCC drivers had just completed repairs and were in their seats preparing to start when the crash came. The impact of the collision shoved the rear truck ahead so that it collided with the one in front, but neither of the drivers were injured. The Daley car was badly wrecked.

Mr. and Mrs. Daley had been visiting at the Lester Foy home in Kalspell, and were returning home when the accident occurred.

DEATH CLAIMS PIONEER HELENA MINING ATTORNEY

Helena, Feb. 8.—Oliver C. Dallas, 78, pioneer mining attorney of Helena, died suddenly at his home here February 4. He had been under medical care for a stomach ailment during the last year, but his death was unexpected. Funeral arrangements are pending.

Mr. Dallas was born in Washington, D. C., and graduated from the law school of Columbia university. He spent some years in Colorado, where he was engaged in important mining litigation before coming to Montana about 1896 to take a position as chief clerk for the U. S. survey general. He remained in the government service for a long time, and later he was employed in the tax department of the city government. He retired about three years ago.

His only surviving relative is the widow, Mrs. Ethel L. Dallas.

**PAT J. DEMPSEY DIES
SUDDENLY IN CHICAGO
ON WAY TO ST. LOUIS**

Patrick J. Dempsey, well-known throughout the state and in Kalispell as Red Cross liaison representative at Fort Harrison, Helena, died very suddenly in Chicago Monday, according to friends here. Mr. Dempsey knew many of the young men of this city through his work at the Fort in Helena and at Carroll College. Mr. Dempsey, at the time, was on his way to St. Louis to attend a meeting of the National Red Cross, and was taken ill Monday morning in Chicago, and died late that afternoon at a Chicago hospital.

He had been suffering last winter from diabetes and heart trouble, which, it is thought caused his death. No word has been received here yet about the funeral arrangements, though Dr. B. F. Vogburgh called Fort Harrison at Helena to learn of arrangements. Mr. Dempsey was an especial friend of Myron Pike, and had visited him and other friends in Kalispell last summer.
