FLATHEAD LAKE IS DRAGGED FOR BODY OF REV. EDGINGTON

(By Associated Press)

Polson, Mont., Sept. 20.—The white-capped waters of Flathead lake were being dragged today along the shore of Wild Horse Island for the body of the Rev. R. C. Edgington, Montana Methodist church official and former chaplain of the state senate. The drowned yesterday near his summer home in an attempt to tie up some small boats during a squall.

The Rev. Edgington was stranded in deep waters off the island's beach while his helper, Delbert Abbot, drifted helplessly away in one of the boats the two men were trying to prevent being dashed to pieces in the rough waters.

Abbot drifted five miles to the mainland in five and one-half hours, the battery of the boat's motor inoperative and only one bar to use as a makeshift steering apparatus.

He summoned help from Polson but the body of the Rev. Edgington could not be located.

The Rev. and Mrs. Edgington had made their summer home on the island several years. Their residence, however, is in Great Falls.

The drowned man came to Montana more than 20 years ago and subsequently held pastorates in Helena, Lewistown and other Montana cities, and was actively engaged in administration of the church's affairs in this state.

In the republican primaries this summer he was an unsuccessful candidate for the office of congressman.

Helena, Mont., Sept. 20.—(AP)—To aid in the search for the body of the Rev. Robert C. Edgington in the waters of Flathead lake, the Rev. A. P. Alton of Helena, left today for Polson and will be joined at Missoula by the Rev. M. E. Van De Mark of that city. Both are Methodist pastors.

MINISTER'S BODY RECOVERED FROM FLATHEAD LAKE

Polson, Sept. 21.—Funeral arrangements were being made today for the Rev. Robert C. Edgington, whose body was recovered late yesterday 400 yards from the place where he drowned Wednesday, just off the beach of his Wild Horse Island summer home on Flathead lake.

The Rev. Edgington lost his life during a squall as he attempted to tie up some small boats that were being dashed against the beach in the storm.

The body was brought here to await word from two sons, Ralph of Los Angeles, and William of Chicago.

WELL-KNOWN MISSOULA WOMAN DIES ON SATURDAY

The following article is taken from The Missoulian concerning the death of Mrs. Lucy Ellithorpe, well-known in Kalispell, and aunt of Mrs. T. H. Bogart:

"Mrs. Lucy Ellen Ellithorpe died Sunday morning at her home, 128 South Fourth street, west. Her death occurred on her ninety-third birthday anniversary, following several months of failing health.

"Mrs. Ellithorpe was born at Oswego, N. Y., January 31, 1841, and went with her parents when a small girl to Olmstead county, Minn., where she was married to Mr. Ellithorpe soon after he was mustered out of the Union army at the close of the Civil war. The family lived for years at Montevideo and St. Paul.

"In 1906 she came to Missoula to make her home with her daughters Mrs. C. L. F. Kellogg and Miss Laura Ellithorpe. Surviving are the two daughters and a granddaughter Mrs. Marion Weinke Wjdenes, who resides in Holland and who formerly made her home with the family here. A niece, Mrs. T. H. Bogart, is here from Kalispell.

"Mrs. Ellithorpe, who had attained her ninety-third birthday, had a keen interest in life up to the last week of her life. She kept posted on affairs through the daily papers and took more than the usual interest in things going on in the world, and she had a keen sense of humor to the last.

"The funeral services will take place at the Episcopal church at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. Rev. Thomas W. Bennett will conduct the services and burial will be in Missoula cemetery."
