JAMES A. FORD DIES AFTER BRIEF ILLNESS

James A. Ford, pioneer resident of Kalspell, passed away at 5 o'clock last evening at his home on First avenue east, at the age of 89. Mr. Ford had been critically ill for some weeks and his death was not unexpected.

He came here about 40 years ago from the Judith Basin, where he had been engaged in the cattle business, and has lived here ever since. He has been a director of the Conrad National bank since its organization in 1891, and had large real estate holdings in Kalspell and Flathead county.

Mr. Ford was born in Ohio, enlisted in the Civil War at its outbreak, and served for three years as a scout. After the war he came west and was engaged in the freighting business in California and Nevada; came into Virginia City with a freight outfit in the days of the gold rush, and afterward settled in the Judith Basin.

Despite his year, Mr. Ford was a very active man. It has been his custom for years to take long walks daily, and he was up and about the streets until his last illness. He had many warm friends here, especially among the older residents.

The funeral will be held at 2 p. m., Monday, August 6, at the Wagener & Campbell chapel, Rev. W. H. Sandy officiating. Interment will be in Conrad Memorial cemetery.
