**FUNERAL IS HELD FOR

Helena, Mar. 8.—The funeral of Mrs. Laura T. Galen, 62, who died March 6, took place yesterday, with services at St. Helena's cathedral. The body was forwarded via the Northern-Pacific to Los Angeles, where interment will be in Calvary cemetery.

Mrs. Galen was the widow of Hugh F. Galen, Montana pioneer real estate dealer who died here some years ago. She was a resident of Broadwater county and Helena for more than 40 years, coming to Montana from her native state of Wisconsin. She is survived by a brother, Alfred Tague, and three sisters, Mrs. D. D. McCarthy and Misses Antonette and Adele V. Tague, all residents of Townsend and by four nephews and a niece.

Mrs. Galen was widely known in Helena, where she was active in religious work.

It is not known definitely when he passed away, but E. Von Emen, acting coroner, after making an investigation, reported that he died some time between Thursday night and Saturday evening, and that his death was due to strychnine poisoning, self-administered. He left a note, giving instructions for his funeral.

When found the body was lying face-down on the floor, and nearby was a partially filled bottle of the poison.—Lake County News.
