POLSON BOY DROWNED WHILE IN DEEP CANAL

Polson, April 9.—Leonard Kirkpatrick, 19, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ross Kirkpatrick, of Polson, was drowned late Saturday afternoon in a Federal canal that empties into the Pablo reservoir a short distance south of here.

The Kirkpatrick boy and Brown companions, Robert and Edward Ross and John Coohed, all about the same age, left their homes early in the afternoon on a bike. They came to the point where the canal pours

into the reservoir and decided to go swimming.

Leonard dived into the cold water, 19 feet in depth, and failed to reappear. The other boys made several attempts to get him out then ran to a nearby field where a man was plowing. The man failed to recover the boy and went to Polson to notify officers and the parents of the youths.

The father of the Ross boys recovered the body of the Kirkpatrick youth after several plunges into the canal.

Coroner John Dixon said how the boy met death still is undetermined. He noted that the extremely cold water might have been the cause and said an inquest will be held.
