ACCIDENT TAKES LIFE OF VETERAN G. N. CONDUCTOR

A. M. Matthews, veteran Great Northern conductor, died at the Sisters' hospital at 8:45 last evening of injuries received in the local railroad yards at about 4:30 yesterday afternoon.

The accident occurred while switching. Three cars were being dropped from the train and shunted onto a sidetrack. Mr. Matthews had pulled the coupling pin and in some unknown manner slipped and fell beneath the cars. He was dragged about 200 feet before the cars could be stopped, both legs were crushed, and his head injured. He was removed at once to the hospital, but was unable to survive the shock and loss of blood. The accident occurred at the lower end of the yards, near Fifth avenue west.

Mr. Matthews was the oldest conductor in point of service on this division, and worked out of Kalispell in the early days before the division point was removed to Whitefish. Afterward he worked on the main line between Whitefish and Spokane, his family still residing at the latter place. About a year ago

he was transferred to the Kalispell branch, and has been living here since that time.

Mrs. Matthews was notified of the accident and will arrive here today

He had evidently retired and later got up to sit before the fire.

Funeral services were held from St. Joseph's Catholic church Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock, and burial was in the Libby cemetery.

FOUNDER OF M. E. CHURCH HERE, DIES

Friends in Kalspell learned of the death last week in Leavenworth, Washington, of the Rev. W. O. Mintzer, who was the founder of the Methodist Episcopal church here. Rev. Mintzer was pastor in Kalspell for three years, beginning in 1893.

He came west from Pennsylvania in the early days and followed the herds of gold-seekers into Virginia City, Montana. Later he moved to Dillon, Montana, then across the Divide on a stage coach road into Salmon City, Idaho. Sometime later, he explored the frontier further to the west into northeastern Washington.

After serving in Kalspell and Great Falls, the Rev. Mr. Mintzer was transferred to the Columbia River conference with headquarters at Olympia, and later, as district superintendent, he lived in Spokane for ten years. A fine organizer, he was responsible for the building up of many Methodist congregations throughout the northwest part of Washington.

The west with its stir of adventure attracted him in his early days, and bringing his 16-year-old bride with him, he sought the sawdust trail of Methoism and in the early '80's received his first appointment, to the Montana conference, where he served at Virginia City, Dillon, Bonwick and later in Salmon City.

At the age of 75, Mr. Mintzer was still very active, and took his wife, and drove across the continent to the Atlantic seaboard and home again. Still tall and straight, with a figure little different from that of his youth and with a heavy head of hair that refused to turn white, the Rev. Mr. Mintzer met his last years with a spirit that was comparatively as dauntless as that of his youth when he braved a primitive west that he saw grow from frontier into city life.

He was 80 years of age when he died.

Scozzari said then he fired on Morey twice with a shotgun. One charge struck Morey in the side and the other penetrated his body near the heart.
