FRANK H. NASH TAKEN BY DEATH

Polson, Mont., May 7.—Frank H. Nash, 76, former judge in the Flathead district, and a father of E. J. Nash of Butte, died at the family home here last night after a week's illness.
The elder Nash came to Kalspell in 1891.

Funeral services for Frank H. Nash, who died Sunday, will be held at Polson on the lawn of Mrs. McIntyre's home at 11 o'clock Tuesday. The remains will be brought to Kalspell and interred in Conrad Memorial cemetery.
The body will arrive about 2:30 p. m., Tuesday and will be taken direct to the cemetery, where it will be met by the pallbearers and friends of the family.
