HEART ATTACK FATAL TO JOSEPH A. ROE

Joseph A. Roe, a resident of Kalispell and vicinity for the past 33 years, died of a sudden heart attack Sunday evening about 7:30 at his tourist camp at North Main and Montana streets.

Very few knew that he was not in the best of health, but it is said that he suffered two heart attacks during the last summer, although his condition was not considered serious. Yesterday he complained of not feeling well during the day, and last evening had entered a cabin and sat down to talk with Charles O'Neil when the end came. Mr. O'Neil states that the attack came without warning; that he suddenly gasped, and fell from his chair. Death was probably instantaneous, as Dr. M. B. Ross was called and found that life had been extinct for several minutes.

Mr. Roe was 62 years of age. For many years he was engaged in farming northwest of Kalispell, but for the past five years has been engaged in the tourist camp business.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 2 p. m., at the Waggoner & Campbell chapel. The funeral will be under the auspices of the Masonic lodge, with Rev. Chas. A. Wilson officiating. Interment will be in Conrad Memorial cemetery.
