Jack Thomelson, the nine year old son of Roy Thomelson of Fortine and Mrs. Margaret Thomelson of 213 Sixth avenue west, Kalispell, was accidentally drowned at 3:15 Sunday afternoon in a small slough of the Flathead river at the eastern edge of Columbia Falls.

He had been making his home with Mrs. Minnie Hammer at Columbia Falls and was playing with Bud Hamner, nine, at the slough. Bud started home and hearing Jack scream and a splash, looked back just in time to see him disappear from sight.

It was nearly 15 minutes before the body was recovered by Fred Schafer who was working near by in the woods and heard the scream.

Dr. Kell was called and worked with the body but no sign of life was present.

The body is at the Waggener and Campbell mortuary, pending funeral arrangements.

A nearby car rushed him to Dr. Kell and to the Sisters hospital but the shock was too great and he passed away about 10:30 o'clock. Mr. Thurman was a resident of Whitefish and was 41 years of age. A sister, Mrs. W. Boshue, of Spokane was notified and arrived Sunday.
