**MRS. ANNIE WALKER PASSES AWAY TODAY**

Mrs. Annie Walker, one of the most prominent pioneers of the Flathead valley, passed away this morning at 6 o'clock at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Archibald Paterson, where she has lived for the past six or eight years.

Mrs. Walker, who was 88 years of age, had been very active and in the best of health until last Sunday when she suffered an attack of influenza, from which she was unable to recover on account of her advanced age.

The funeral will be held Monday, April 23, at 2 o'clock at the Presbyterian church, and interment will be in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.

Mrs. Walker, with her husband, Charles M. Walker, whose death occurred over 20 years ago, came here in 1882, and established the Caledonian Hotel, now known as the National. After the death of her husband Mrs. Walker continued in the hotel business until about eight years ago, when on account of her age she was obliged to retire from active business.

She was born in Cartadale, Argyllshire, Scotland, but was in business in Glasgow for several years prior to 1889, when she and her husband came to Montreal. They remained there but a short time, when they moved to Butte, and then to Kalispell soon after the Great Northern built through this section of Montana. Mrs. Walker had a wide acquaintance, retained her faculties unimpaired to the last, and had the highest respect and admiration of all who knew her.

**AARON WALTER DEAD,  
RELATIVES ATTEND  
FUNERAL, BROWNING**

J. S. Walter and two sons and E. M. Walter all of Kalispell R.F.D. No. 1 returned yesterday from Browning where they had been to attend the funeral of their brother and uncle, Aaron Walter, an oldtimer in Flathead valley.

They drove to Browning leaving Sunday and returning last night. They went via Missoula and over McDonald pass to Helena and from there to Great Falls and Browning.

East of the mountains they found conditions greatly different than from the Flathead. Between Great Falls and Browning they report 15 below zero with a great deal of snow and many drifts. Browning they said was practically snowed under. Returning from Browning to Great

Falls they went by the way of Conrad instead of following the federal highway, as they were advised it was a better road. Here they said the road was just a sheet of glare ice making driving particularly dangerous. They made the 500 mile trip over in about 13 hours, and the same coming back.

Aaron Walter had been a resident of Flathead county for 40 years and died at Browning last Saturday. Services were held there.

**BODY FOUND ON RAILWAY TRACKS IS IDENTIFIED AS THAT OF ERNEST WELLS**

The body found along the railway tracks east of Columbia Falls early yesterday morning has been identified as that of Ernest G. Wells of Canton, North Carolina, and his father is living at that place and has been notified.

The identification was traced through the transient registration bureau of Whitefish, where he had previously registered and a personal description was found which checked with that of the deceased man. A close examination by the coroner indicates a bruised elbow, shoulder and cheek bone and a small laceration of the forehead, all marks appearing on the right side, and coincide with marks in the railway grade where he fell.

This bears out the theory that he simply fell from the train and died from injuries and exposure following. Unless new evidence is discovered there will be no inquest.
