TREGO MAN SLAIN; TAKEN FOR A DEER

Information was received here today of the killing of Wilbur Coe of Trego, who was shot in mistake for a deer near Trego by Clarence De Lager last Thursday evening.

Both men were employed at the O'Malley tie camp, and about 6 p. m., Thursday De Lager took a Krag-Jorgensen rifle and went deer hunting. He circled, and when back near the camp heard a noise in the brush and fired, striking Coe. The bullet passed through his chest, puncturing his spine, and killing him instantly.

A coroner's inquest was held at Eureka Saturday morning, the jury finding that Coe came to his death accidentally, and exonerating De Lager. Later in the day De Lager was arraigned before Justice Frost, at Eureka, charged with manslaughter, and he was bound over to the district court in the sum of \$1,000. He was unable to furnish bail, and was taken in custody by Sheriff Bailey of Lincoln county. Coe leaves a wife and eight children. De Lager who is 21, came to Trego about six weeks ago from Shelby, but his home is said to be in Valier. At the inquest it developed that Coe was shot from a distance of only 46 feet. The accident occurred at about 7 o'clock.
